

How the St. John's Roster System Works

The Roster system automatically sorts the scheduling drop-down lists by an algorithm that accounts for how much each person has been scheduled around the date of the event being scheduled. If they have already been scheduled a lot around that date then they will have a lower score for scheduling and will appear lower on the list. If they haven't been scheduled much then they will have a higher score and appear higher on the list. The auto schedule function simply chooses the highest person on the list, and if that person is already scheduled it will choose then next person on the list.

There is a new feature in the Roster system called The Scheduling Frequency Preference bar, which gives additional or fewer points to the participant. If you want to be scheduled more often you can move the bar to the right and it will raise your score and thus your probability of being scheduled. If you want to be scheduled less then move the bar to the left and you will lower your scheduling score and thus be less likely to be scheduled.
