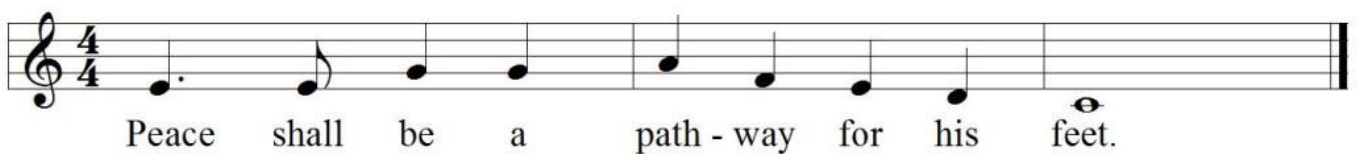

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

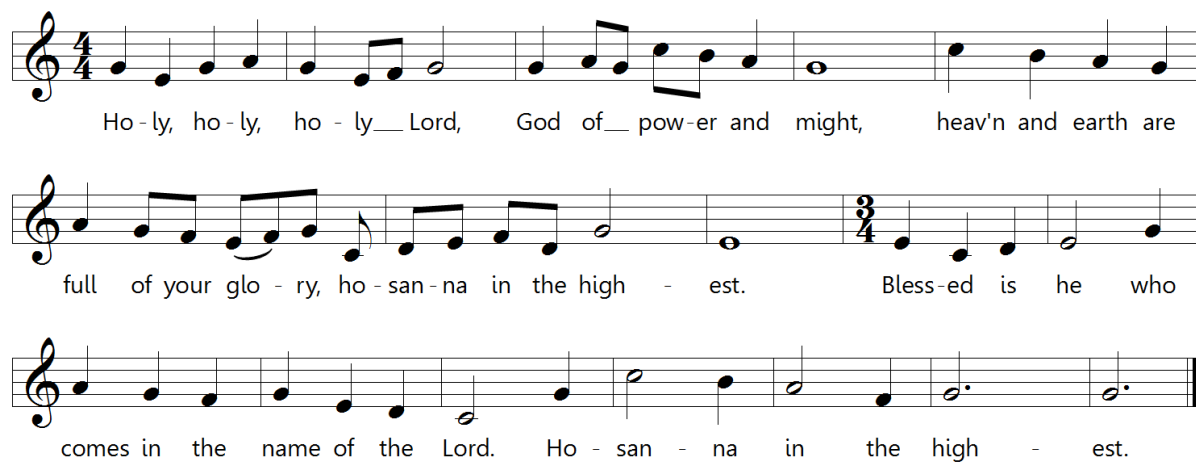
It is right to give thanks and praise.

Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again.

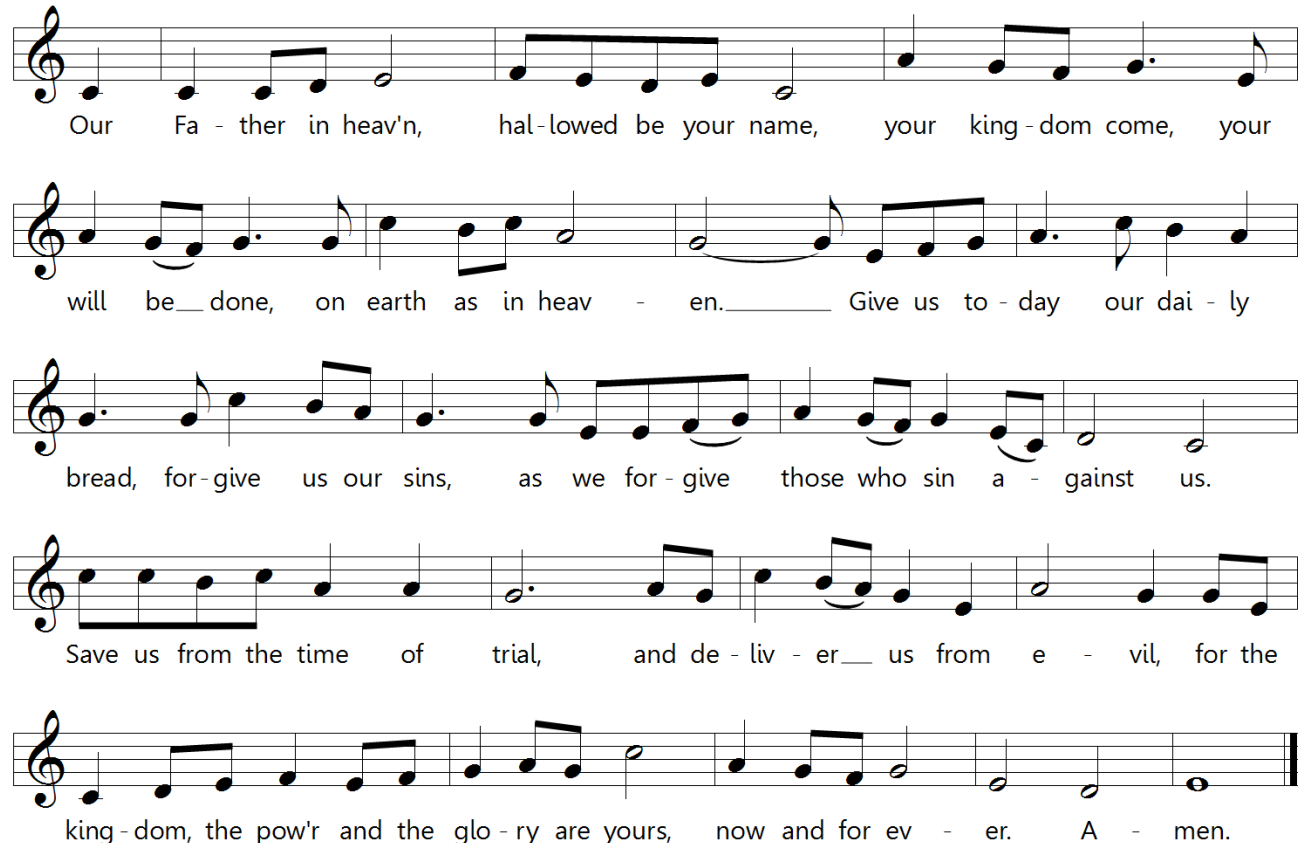
