10:13 The hired hand runs away because a hired hand does not care for the sheep.

10:14 I am the good shepherd. I know my own and my own know me,

10:15 just as the Father knows me and I know the Father. And I lay down my life for the sheep.

10:16 I have other sheep that do not belong to this fold. I must bring them also, and they will listen to my voice. So there will be one flock, one shepherd.

10:17 For this reason the Father loves me, because I lay down my life in order to take it up again.

10:18 No one takes it from me, but I lay it down of my own accord. I have power to lay it down, and I have power to take it up again. I have received this command from my Father."

We thank you for the doctors and nurses working in hospitals this week. Give them everything they need to do their work. Watch over their families. Grant them sleep at night, and energy during the day. Sustain their hearts, and may you bless them with people to minister to their needs, even as they minister to those who are sick and dying.

We pray for the church, remembering our parish leaders at St John's, for our rector and churchwardens, members of parish council, the choir and all our parish groups. We pray for those who are isolated at this time and we ask your guidance in reaching out, bringing people together in community, and remembering those who need support.

We pray for the whole church, especially our Anglican family in the Diocese of Ottawa. We pray for Bishop Shane Parker. We and for all who serve our church in parish ministries and outreach ministries in the Diocese of Ottawa. At this time, we especially pray for the new process on the Future Shape of Parish Ministry.

We remember our partnership with the Episcopal Diocese of Jerusalem. We pray for Archbishop Suheil in this time of transition as Bishop Hosam Naoum , former Dean of the Diocese of Jerusalem is installed as the new Archbishop of Jerusalem on May 13. We pray especially for the Jerusalem Princess Basma Center, serving disabled children in the West Bank, a ministry supported by the Diocese of Ottawa.

We thank you for the blessing of family and friends, and for the loving care that surrounds us on every side. We thank you for setting tasks that demand our best efforts, and for leading us to accomplishments that satisfy and delight us. We thank you also for those disappointments and failures that lead us to acknowledge our dependence on you alone.
