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The Gospel

The Holy Gospel of our Savior Jesus Christ according to Matthew.

Glory to you, Lord Christ.

After Jesus' birth—which happened in Bethlehem of Judea, during the reign of Herod—astrologers from the East arrived in Jerusalem and asked, “Where is the newborn ruler of the Jews? We observed his star at its rising and have come to pay homage.” At this news Herod became greatly disturbed, as did all of Jerusalem. Summoning all the chief priests and religious scholars of the people, he asked them where the Messiah was to be born.

“In Bethlehem of Judea,” they informed him. “Here is what the prophet has written: ‘And you, Bethlehem, land of Judah, are by no means least among the leaders of Judah, since from you will come a ruler who is to shepherd my people Israel.’ ”

Herod called the astrologers aside and found out from them the exact time of the star’s appearance. Then he sent them to Bethlehem, after having instructed them, “Go and get detailed information about the child. When you have found him, report back to me—so that I may go and offer homage, too.”

After their audience with the ruler, they set out. The star which they had observed at its rising went ahead of them until it came to a standstill over the place where the child lay. They were overjoyed at seeing the star and, upon entering the house, found the child with Mary, his mother. They prostrated themselves and paid homage. Then they opened their coffers and presented the child with gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh. They were warned in a dream not to return to Herod, so they went back to their own country by another route.

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church,
the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins,
the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting.

Will you continue in the apostles' teaching and fellowship, in the breaking of bread, and in the prayers?
I will, with God's help.

Will you persevere in resisting evil, and, whenever you fall into sin, repent and return to the Lord?
I will, with God's help.

Will you proclaim by word and example the Good News of God in Christ?
I will, with God's help.

Will you seek and serve Christ in all persons, loving your neighbor as yourself?
I will, with God's help.

Will you strive for justice and peace among all people, and respect the dignity of every human being?
I will, with God's help.

Let us now pray for these persons who are to receive the Sacrament of new birth and for those who have renewed their commitment to Christ.

Deliver them, O Lord, from the way of sin and death.
Lord, hear our prayer.

Open their hearts to your grace and truth.
Lord, hear our prayer.

Fill them with your holy and life-giving Spirit.
Lord, hear our prayer.

Keep them in the faith and communion of your holy Church.
Lord, hear our prayer.

Teach them to love others in the power of the Spirit.
Lord, hear our prayer.

Send them into the world in witness to your love.
Lord, hear our prayer.

Bring them to the fullness of your peace and glory.
Lord, hear our prayer.
A period of silence follows.

Grant, O Lord, that all who are baptized into the death of Jesus Christ your Son may live in the power of his resurrection and look for him to come again in glory; who lives and reigns now and forever. **Amen.**

Thanksgiving over the Water

God be with you.

And also with you.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

It is right to give God thanks and praise.

We thank you, Almighty God, for the gift of water. Over it the Holy Spirit moved in the beginning of creation. Through it you led the children of Israel out of their bondage in Egypt into the land of promise. In it your Son Jesus received the baptism of John and was anointed by the Holy Spirit as the Messiah, the Christ, to lead us, through his death and resurrection, from the bondage of sin into everlasting life.

We thank you, God, for the water of Baptism. In it we are buried with Christ in his death. By it we share in his resurrection. Through it we are reborn by the Holy Spirit. Therefore in joyful obedience to your Son, we bring into his fellowship those who come to him in faith, baptizing them in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

Now sanctify this water, we pray you, by the power of your Holy Spirit, that those who here are cleansed from sin and born again may continue for ever in the risen life of Jesus Christ our Savior. To him, to you, and to the Holy Spirit, be all honor and glory, now and for ever. **Amen.**

Give them an inquiring and discerning heart, the courage to will and to persevere, a spirit to know and to love you, and the gift of joy and wonder in all your works. **Amen.**

Let us welcome the newly baptized.

We receive you into the household of God. Confess the faith of Christ crucified, proclaim his resurrection, and share with us in his eternal priesthood.

A baptismal candle for each newly baptized person is lit from the Paschal candle, symbolizing the light of Christ in each one's life.



Eucharist means "thanksgiving." In this meal we give thanks for all that God has done for us, and we offer ourselves back to God.

The Lord be with you.
And also with you.

Lift up your hearts.

We lift them up to the Lord.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

It is right to give God thanks and praise.

We thank you, God our Father. You are our Mother too, because your love has made us live for you and for each other. Because of your love, we can share our joys and sorrows.

We thank you, God, with glad hearts, and we join with everyone who believes in you; with the saints and the angels, we rejoice and praise you as we say,

You are holy, O God. You are kind to us and to all people. For this we thank you. We thank you above all for your Son, Jesus Christ. You sent Jesus into this world because people had turned away from you and no longer loved each other.

Jesus opened our eyes and our hearts to understand that we are sisters and brothers and that you are our Father and our Mother. Jesus now brings us together to one table and asks us to do what he did.

Loving God, we ask you to bless these gifts of bread and wine and make them holy. May they be for us the body and blood of Jesus Christ, your Son.

On the night before he died for us, Jesus was at supper for the last time with his friends. He took bread and gave you thanks. He broke the bread and gave it to them, saying: **“Take this, all of you, and eat it: This is my body which will be given for you.”**

In the same way he took a cup of wine. He gave you thanks and handed the cup to his friends, saying: **“Take this, all of you and drink from it. This is the cup of God’s new promise. It will be poured out for you and for everyone so that sin may be forgiven. Do this in memory of me.”**

And so, O God, we remember with joy everything that Jesus did to save us. In this holy sacrifice which he gave as a gift to his church, we remember his death and resurrection. Accept us, together with Jesus. He died for us, but you raised him to new life.

Jesus now lives with you in glory, but he is also here on earth among us. And he will come again in glory; and then there will be no more suffering, no more tears, no more sadness. Until that time, you call us to receive these gifts at this table and to be filled with the joy of the Holy Spirit.

Be with those who follow Jesus as they work for peace and to bring justice and love to others. And bring us all together to make the kingdom of heaven on earth. **Amen.**

If you need gluten-free wafers, please say "gluten free" to the person distributing bread. If you prefer to receive the bread only (and not wine), please come forward and say "bread only."

If you prefer not to receive communion, we invite you to come forward with your hands crossed at your shoulders, and the minister will offer a blessing for your presence with us today. Let an usher know if you would like a minister to bring communion to you in your seat.
