



Motor City Mission Corps is a year long nonprofit apprenticeship for young adults with a focus on breaking down racism and building equitable community.

Participants live in community, serve in organizations with a reputation for making change in the city of Detroit and explore how they might be called to join God's work in the world.

Housing and a small stipend are provided.

Placements are diverse in the the opportunities they offer:

Cass Community Social Services

CCSS grew out of the work of Cass Community United Methodist Church with the homeless and developmentally disabled in their immediate community. They now work to connect and lift up residents in the areas of food, health, housing and jobs.

Presbyterian Villages of Michigan

PVM is a large faith-based nonprofit organization serving the needs of seniors throughout the state of Michigan. They have nine facilities in the city of Detroit and are committed to serving senior citizens of all faiths, walks of life, and financial means.

Southwest Detroit Immigrant and Refugee Center

Despite their growing presence in Detroit, immigrants and refugees here have difficulty obtaining affordable legal services, housing, and assistance in establishing businesses. The Southwest Detroit Immigrant and Refugee Center helps meets these needs . . . one family at a time

Westminster Church of Detroit

Westminster Church has a long history of mission in the surrounding community. Westminster calls itself "a church for all people," and the congregation is a mixture of African-American, white and African members.
