Her family was commissioned in October 2015, and they moved to Quezon City in March 2016. She is the first Regional Facilitator for Addressing Migration and Human Trafficking. In this role, she has visited churches and organizations around the Philippines, Thailand, Indonesia, Myanmar, Sri Lanka, Nepal, United Arab Emirates, Morocco and Ecuador. She volunteers with the secretariat of



Churches Witnessing with Migrants (CWWM), an international tripartite network of migrants, migrant-serving organizations, and faith communities. She is also a member of the Interfaith Network for the Rights for Migrants (INFORM) Steering Committee, a regional network encompassing Asia and the Pacific, and the Middle East. Cathy graduated from Princeton Theological Seminary with Master of Divinity, as well as Carnegie Mellon University, with Master and Bachelor degrees in Public Policy and Management.
