pathways for providers for 13 years. Renee is an active member of the community. She serves on the boards of her local Early Childhood Council; Alliance for Kids and for Joint Initiatives. Renee often speaks on early childhood issues at Local and National Conferences. She completed her undergraduate degree at Ashford University in Organizational Management with a Minor in Early Childhood Education. Later she completed a Master degree, Magna Cum Laude, in Teaching with Learning Technology from Ashford University. Renee is married and is a retired military spouse.
