

WHY CATHEDRAL HOME?

A BRIEF HISTORY OF CATHEDRAL HOME



Established in 1910

Archdeacon of the Episcopal Church of Wyoming became the caregiver of two children who had been abandoned in Lander, WY. This prompted the need for the first ever children's home and orphanage in Wyoming.



Mission

Enriching the well-being of youth and families.



Vision

Strive for a future where every child and family, regardless of their background or circumstances, has the resources to truly thrive.



Programming

- Residential Facility 95 clients
- May Olsen Education Center Accredited School
- Community Resource Center 273 Clients
- Laramie Youth Crisis Center 180 Clients
- Group Home Services 2 group home beds in all of WY
- Outpatient Counseling 126 clients



BRIEF UNDERSTANDING OF STUDENTS SERVED



Population Served

- Age Range 12-18 years old
- Treatment can be anywhere from 6-9 months based on need
- Clients come from Nebraska, Wyoming, and South Dakota
- Two Female Cottages and Three Male Cottages



Reasons for Treatment

- Truancy
- DFS Referral
- Family Sponsorship



Student Backgrounds

• Experiencing homelessness, drug use, food insecurity, violence, delinquency, difficulties in school, mental health struggles, etc.




Timeline Overview
