



City invests in new affordable housing

The Affordable Housing Investment Program provides grant funding to eligible non-profit and private sector entities, targeting shovel-ready proposals to encourage affordable housing development in Edmonton. The grants provide up to 25% of the capital costs of newly constructed or rehabilitated affordable housing offered at below-market rates. The successful applicants in the second round of funding are:

Family Reunification Centre and 24 Nations Lodge - Treaty 8 First Nations of Alberta Holdings Ltd.

- \$6,000,000 for 30 units of family-oriented supportive housing for Indigenous parents and children and 32 “home away from home” studio suites for visiting community members receiving medical care in Edmonton.
- The Family Reunification Centre will help reestablish Indigenous parenting practices severed by residential schools and mitigate the growing number of Indigenous children in care.

Maple Crest - Avana Rentals Alberta Inc.

- Family-friendly mixed-market development in the Maple neighbourhood in southeast Edmonton, which currently has no non-market affordable housing.
- \$1,730,831 in grant funding for 30 rental townhomes offered at below-market rates (ranging from 50% to 80% of average market rents).
- Avana is working with the YWCA to provide affordable housing opportunities for women and children, with on-site support like psychological services and career counselling and amenities like a playground and walking path to nearby wetlands.

Beacon Heights - Right at Home Housing Society

- \$1,948,750 in grant funding for 21 units in a low-rise apartment designed for families, with a mix of two, three, and four-bedroom units, including three barrier-free units for people with disabilities.
- Geared toward newcomer families, with referrals and support from the Multicultural Health Brokers and Islamic Family and Social Services Association.

Legacy Project - Right at Home Housing Society

- Through the adaptive reuse of a neighbourhood church, this development will provide housing for families and individuals, including youth.
- \$689,821 for 11 units, including two accessible units.
