A summary of the results from PREG Parking Impact Survey, conducted in 2024. Social media was used to solicit responses: facebook, nextdoor, PREG newsletter.

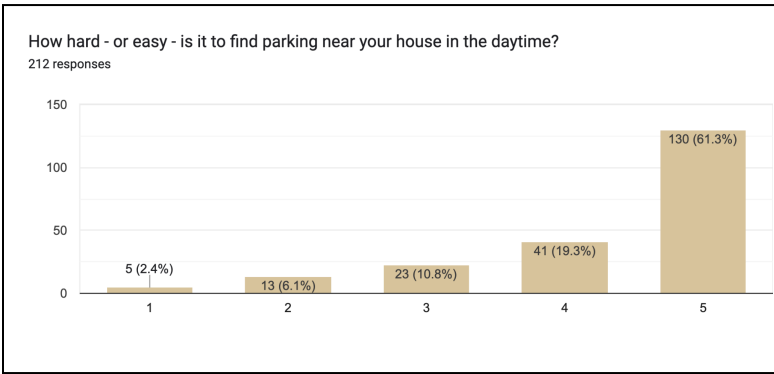
Responses:

212 responses with a broad range of opinions shows that parking is a concern for many EG residents. Asking what style of house tells us that we have more information from single family homeowners than other groups, which may alter the data.

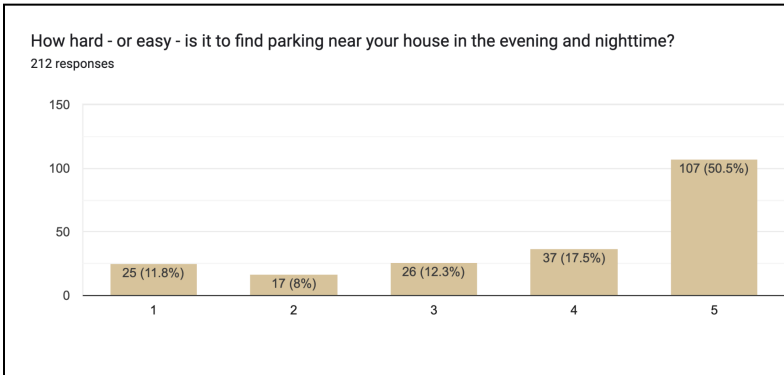
Conclusion: Opinions (see final page) ranged from feeling like parking is not a problem and shouldn't slow down any potential building of the Town Center, to very concerned that a commercial area will adversely affect the neighborhood. The charts show results for the whole set of respondents; more data crunching is needed to sort which neighbors are more or less concerned based on where they live.

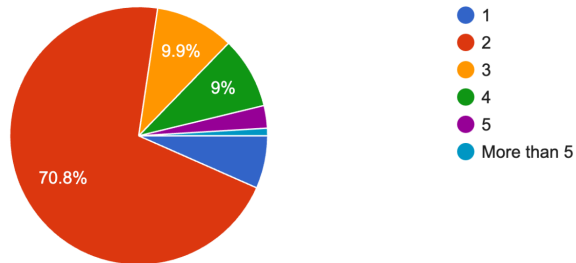
These two questions asked respondents to rank from “1: very hard to find” to “5: very easy, no problem”



Next we asked about number of spaces allocated vs actual number of cars

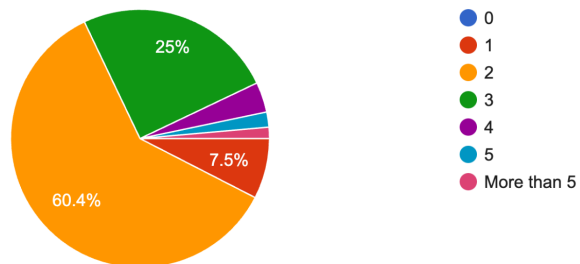
How many total parking spaces (garage, driveway, pad, and/or apartment space) are assigned to your household?

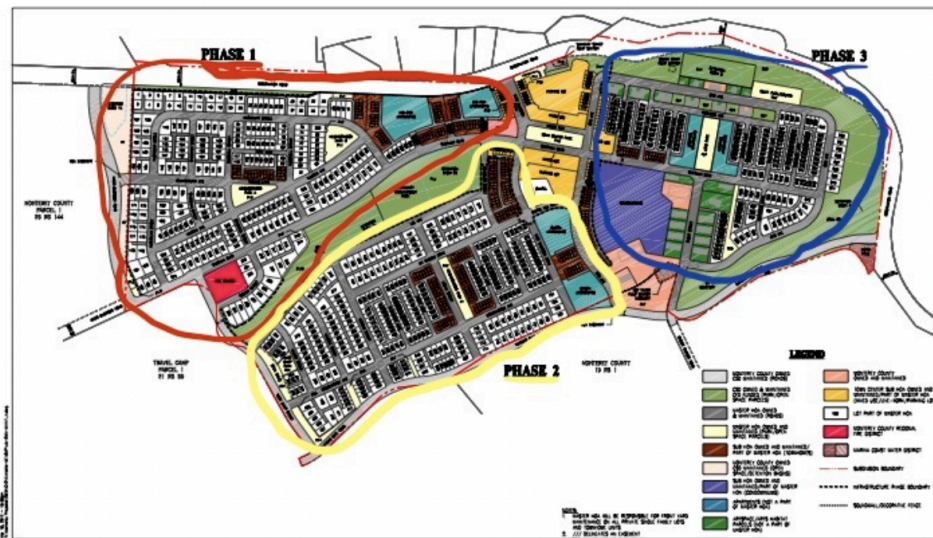


How many vehicles are part of your household?

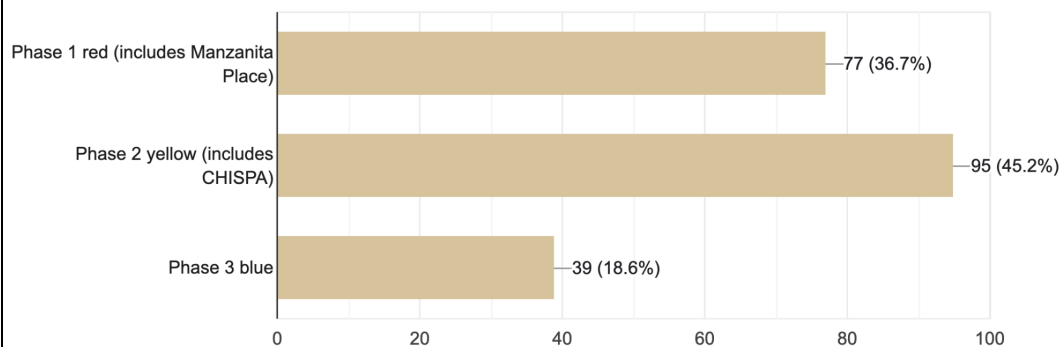


We asked where respondents live, using this map



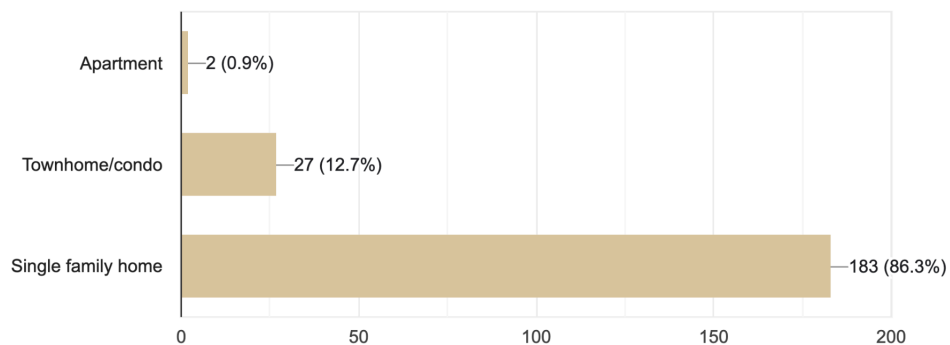
What Phase do you live in?

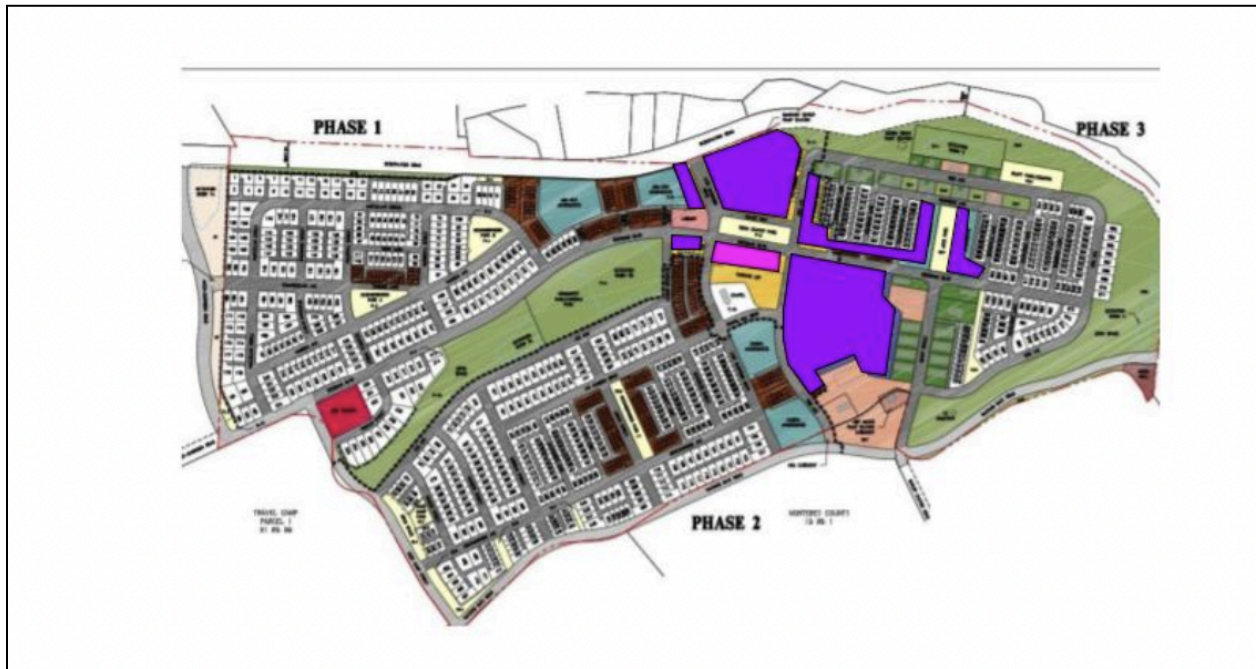


What style of house do you live in?
