

The Hassle-Free Extended Essay

How to simplify writing the 4000-word extended essay? With the help of our dedicated librarian, Ms. McGreal, an extended essay launching session is planned for June 8, from 9 am to noon. During this time, the IB Diploma Class of 2022 will begin work on the nine-month long research and writing project. The extended essay, a core component of the full diploma program, offers preparation for the kind of sophisticated writing that students will be expected to do in college. With the help of their faculty mentors, students will refine their research questions, consult scholarly sources, compile notes, and continue the task of reading and reflecting on their topic. Three scheduled revision deadlines— in September, November, and January—should enable students to progress successfully throughout the process. The finished product is due February 8, 2022.



Countdown to JULY 6, 2021

In May IB exams took place in an effort to return to some measure of normality in an otherwise extraordinary year. July 6 is the day of reckoning-- IB students across the globe will receive their exam results. Scores may be accessed at <https://candidates.ibo.org> using a personal code and pin. Browsers such as Explorer and Mozilla are most user friendly. Please bear in mind that e-traffic will be heavy that day; remain patient if access is not immediately available and keep trying. We anticipate strong results for our 98 seniors and juniors who faced three weeks of intensive assessments with grace and confidence.
