



Trinity High School is hosting a remote summer school program for two credit bearing courses, Health and Public Speaking. These courses are for rising sophomore, junior and senior students only. Courses will take place Monday through Thursday, June 8 - June 25. Students will follow the same structure as we have followed for remote learning during block 4. Students will check in each morning at 9:00 AM for attendance. Teachers will post the day's learning activities and assignments by 8:00 AM each day. Students will have until the next morning to complete the assignments. Please note that the shorter duration of the courses will mean that students are expected to spend 3.25 hours per course each day rather than the 60 minutes that they were spending per course during block 4. If a teacher is hosting a virtual class, the Health class will meet at 9:00 AM and the Public Speaking class will meet at 12:00 PM. Given the nature of Public Speaking, students should anticipate requirements for virtual class meetings. These scheduled times will allow for a student to sign up for both classes should she wish to do so.

**Cost:** \$750 per course - \$75 deposit (\$150 if signing up for both courses) payment is due by Friday, May 1, 2020, the remaining balance is due on or before the first day of summer school, Monday, June 8, 2020. ### **Course Offerings:**

#### ☐ **890 - HEALTH**

**.5 credit**

In this required course, students will study wellness, nutrition, stress management, mental and emotional health, human sexuality, and the effects of alcohol and drug use. This course explores the concepts and roles of these various contributors to physical and emotional health and their effects on people's current and future daily life. This course also includes a unit on CPR/AED training.

#### ☐ **143 - PUBLIC SPEAKING**

**.5 credit**

This required course stresses oral communication, rhetorical analysis, figurative language, and research skills. Students organize, develop, and deliver a variety of speeches using digital media; analyze structure, effective language, and rhetorical techniques used in famous speeches; and conduct short research projects to inform their own speeches. Speaking, listening, research, and critical thinking skills are developed.
