**Families of Trinity High School students
can apply for Illinois Tax Credit Scholarships!
FIRST COME, FIRST SERVED!!**

The Tax Credit Scholarship will cover up to 100% of K-12 private school tuition up to a maximum of the average Illinois cost to educate, which is roughly \$13,764. Tax Credit Scholarships are need based and do not have academic requirements, and they are available for the 2021/22 school year. Below is more information about how to apply and details on eligibility requirements.

Application process: You will need to apply for tax credit scholarships through a scholarship granting organization (SGO), which will manage this process, instead of Trinity High School directly. Trinity High School is working with three SGO's: HighSight, Big Shoulders, and Empower Illinois.

Big Shoulders SGO is scheduled to begin taking applications for scholarships on **Tuesday, January 12, 2021 at 8:00 a.m.** Apply at <https://www.bigshouldersfundsgo.org/apply>

How to qualify:

Eligibility to receive a scholarship is based on your family's household income. [Click here](#) for more information on eligibility for tax credit scholarships.

What you need to apply: Based on what we know today, families will need the following documents in order to apply for a tax credit scholarship:

Copy of 2019 or 2020 federal tax return or 1099, W-2 or year-end pay stubs

Proof of Illinois residency (driver's license, state ID or utility bill)

Documentation of student age (birth certificate, federal/state ID or passport)

If available, a letter of acceptance or enrollment at Trinity High School

Note: There may be changes to this list and updates will be provided as they become available.

Scholarships will be awarded on a first come, first served basis, so it is very important that when the application process begins, you apply early.
