## The Year We've Had and The Year Ahead

For Ohr Kodesh, June is a time to take stock. Time to take stock of the year past and to look ahead to the year upcoming. It is fortunate that Jewish practice affords many opportunities throughout the year to take stock, so we as Jews are quite experienced at this. According to the *Mishnah*, in fact, we have four different "new years" in which we are able to take stock: *Rosh Hashanah*, *Tu BiShvat*, a couple of weeks before *Pesach*, and one month before *Rosh Hashanah*.

I hope you can remember a time before the COVID-19 global pandemic; I know it's hard. If you can, you can reflect with me that many wonderful things have happened this past year. There are so many that I could not possibly list them all, but here are a few.

Our Alvin Browdy Religious School (ABRS) grew again and even further advanced and strengthened its educational delivery. Our Early Childhood Center (ECC) continued its long legacy of excellence. We added new members to our community, many of whom have immediately stepped in to participate actively in OKC life. These new members come from all stages of life: from young families to retirees, several of whom are the parents of current members (Hi, Mom! Welcome! ☺). We learned together as a community through Project Zug, Torah study, lectures, Learners' Lunches, Israel programming, and a lot more. We proudly welcomed our *B'nei Mitzvah* celebrants into Jewish adulthood and have seen many of them become regular participants in our religious services. Students graduated from their schools. We supported each other on regular days and during the tough days when we needed help most. We gave of ourselves to the surrounding community via social action. We advanced our facility security. We improved OKC's financial health through budget deficit reduction and good fundraising – which means we have put ourselves on a more solid foundation to face the challenges yet to come. The strollers continued to be double-parked in the office wing on *Shabbat* mornings. And much, much more.

Sadly, though, even leaving aside COVID-19 we had our down moments too. We lost family members and friends, both young and old. We continued to observe the rise of antisemitism, thankfully with no incidents in our neighborhood but nevertheless with the understanding that what affects one Jewish community impacts us all. The pandemic hit us at *Purim*, first causing us to cancel the *Purim* Carnival and then shutting our synagogue facility soon after. We spent *Pesach* at much smaller tables. We greatly miss being together for *Shabbat*, *Chag*, *minyans*, schools, and programs. We are limited to virtual presence for funerals and *shivah*. Our physical distancing will be

### MISSION STATEMENT

Ohr Kodesh is a warm, engaging, traditional Conservative Congregation that welcomes Jews from a broad range of backgrounds to celebrate Judaism through *Torah* (education), *Tefillah* (prayer), and *Chesed* (social responsibility) as a *Kehillah* (community).

## Religious Practice for the Duration of the Imposed Isolation

In keeping with the changes that were sent via email, when 10 adult Jews are gathered together through real-time video and audio connection (e.g. a Zoom call), those who are in a period of mourning or observing a *yahrzeit* may recite the mourner's *kaddish*. If 10 adult Jews are not present, a Prayer in Lieu of *Kaddish* is recited.

with us through the end of this *shul* year and well into the next one. There is no sugar coating it – we face a significant challenge.

And yet... Ohr Kodesh pivoted extremely quickly to virtual get-togethers, learning programs, and celebrations via our eOK online platform. It has been great seeing so many congregants engaged in these forums — quite a large percentage of our congregation has logged in. Everyone is welcome, so please participate and spread the word. Many congregants have learned new technologies — I admire that so much. Our clergy and staff have done amazing work behind the scenes and front-and-center all year, but particularly in the last few months. Our volunteer team of health professionals has provided exceptional guidance and input as to how we respond to the pandemic and adapt as circumstances warrant. We turned nearly every in-person program we have into a successful virtual version. The creativity, energy and volunteerism that it took to do that truly inspire me. I hope they inspire you too. We adapted, adjusted based on feedback, and continue to do so as we forge ahead. If you want some joy in your week, I recommend logging on to *Kabbalat Shabbat* on Friday evening; then listen at the end when there is a wonderful cascade of voices and smiling faces wishing each other “*Shabbat Shalom!*” over and over for several minutes. We continue to innovate; we welcome everyone’s participation in creating and re-creating the things we do.

At the end of this month, our school year, programming year, and operating year come to a close; we therefore get heavily engaged in planning for the coming year. We celebrate our school graduates. We appreciate our Board members and committee chairs who are stepping over to other activities and we welcome new leaders. I want to thank our outgoing Board members Karen Grad-Steiner, Perry Smith, Deb Bilek, and Rachel Scher Wolf for their extraordinary service to Ohr Kodesh during their terms. We plan to welcome four exceptional leaders as new Board members next month; I will write more about that in the next Bulletin.

We have so much to look forward to for the coming year, even with the huge challenges we face because of the global pandemic. By necessity our coming together whenever that is possible, either in person or virtually, will be different. Our High Holidays will be different, and we are thinking about how we create those sacred times and spaces that are so important to us. We will need to continue to innovate, and in fact to accelerate our innovation; I’m truly excited to see what we come up with. We have an **opportunity** to think differently and to strengthen ourselves. Many of you have already offered your thoughts, suggestions, and willingness to volunteer. What a rare and wonderful thing to be able to celebrate Rabbi Fishman’s four decades in the rabbinate. We will have that rare opportunity for OKC to seek, interview, and hire a new Rabbi. Amidst that formidable challenge, we look forward to an exciting time for us and OKC!

One final note as we reflect back on this year. It was relayed to me by someone who attended a major gathering of Conservative Movement clergy and lay leaders earlier this year, that a speaker from the podium told the assembled, and I’m paraphrasing here, if you want to see a synagogue with significantly high vibrancy and serious commitment to Jewish life, then check out Ohr Kodesh Congregation. What a wonderful thing to be said about our *kehilla*.

Onward. Let’s embrace the coming year, challenges and all, and continue to build the Ohr Kodesh community together.

## Update From the Rabbinic Search Committee

During the past two months over 160 members participated in 21 focus groups, which included in person, by teleconference, and virtual meetings. Over 15 volunteers helped run the meetings, including many members who are not on the search committee. Currently a group of 12 members are analyzing, reviewing and summarizing all of the notes collected. When complete, the summary will be relied upon for several purposes: identifying areas to probe further in an online survey; informing the criteria we will use to evaluate candidates; and providing information to convey a full picture of our community in our job posting. We’re so grateful for the great interest of the many who took time to participate as well as the invaluable volunteer support!

I have access to fresh food, and I am not starving. If I need any help, I can reach out. I can reach my friends and family by phone and check in on them. My friends and family likewise check in on me, because they care for me. For this bounty and connectivity, I feel gratitude.

Many people in the world would gladly trade their everyday problems for the small inconveniences I am experiencing right now. I may have anxious dreams, but I'm dreaming them on a proper bed. I'm not sleeping on the sidewalk, in a field, or under a roadway. I am truly grateful for my own space.

This global health crisis connects me to people around the world and reminds me of our common humanity. When something tragic happens to another country I will respond to it not with superiority, but with humility and recognition that we are all global citizens.

I am surrounded by books, music, and art. I can find distractions and entertainment while I wait for normal life to return.


I am surrounded by love. The trees have already bloomed. The world is moving on. And I feel deep, profound gratitude for all that we have!

*The Secret Chord: A Novel* by Geraldine Brooks will be discussed.

The book is a rich and utterly absorbing novel about the life of King David, from the Pulitzer Prize-winning author of *People of the Book* and *March*. *The Secret Chord* provides new context for some of the best-known episodes of David's life while also focusing on others, even more remarkable and emotionally intense, which have been neglected. We see David through the eyes of those who love him or fear him—from the prophet Natan, voice of his conscience, to his wives Mikhal, Avigail, and Batsheva, and finally to Solomon, the late-born son who redeems his Lear-like old age.

*I Want You to Know We're Still Here, A Post-Holocaust Memoir* by Esther Safran Foer will be discussed.

Esther Safran Foer grew up in a home where the past was too terrible to speak of. The child of parents who were each the sole survivors of their respective families, for Esther the Holocaust loomed in the backdrop of daily life, felt but never discussed. The result was a childhood marked by painful silences and continued tragedy. Even as she built a successful career, married, and raised three children, Esther always felt herself searching.

So when Esther's mother casually mentions an astonishing revelation—that her father had a previous wife and daughter, both killed in the Holocaust—Esther resolves to find out who they were, and how her father survived. Armed with only a black-and-white photo and a hand-drawn map, she travels to Ukraine, determined to find the shtetl where her father hid during the war. What she finds reshapes her identity and gives her the opportunity to finally mourn.

## Religious Activities Committee Report

The High Holidays will arrive on schedule this year, when the month of *Tishrei* begins (September 19, 2020 on the secular calendar). Unfortunately, we do not know to what degree the statewide restrictions on group gatherings mandated by the COVID-19 pandemic will have eased by then, and therefore to what extent Ohr Kodesh will be able to offer services for the *Yamim Nor'a'im*. Various scenarios and options are currently being studied, and the congregation will be kept informed as plans develop that are consistent with governmental restrictions, the recommendations of our team of health professionals, and Ohr Kodesh's congregational needs and priorities.

While the building remains closed, Ohr Kodesh is offering all congregants the option of borrowing *siddurim* for personal use at their homes. Book pickups should be coordinated with Executive Director Jerry Kiewe. Safety precautions will be taken and required measures will be communicated by Jerry Kiewe to those who coordinate pickup.

If you decide to borrow *siddurim*, please consider using one of the two we are currently studying for eventual use when we can once again be together as a congregation. They are *Lev Shalem* (many of you know it as "the red book") and *Siddur Chadash-Moreshet Edition* (known as "the blue book"). If you choose one of the pilot program *siddurim*, please provide your

reactions to it. A suggested list of considerations and the email to which responses can be sent will be included with the books when you pick them up.

# We Celebrate Pride!

Ohr Kodesh is committed to being a warm and supportive spiritual home for all Jews, whatever their sexual orientation or gender identity. We wish to be known as a synagogue that fully embraces the Jewish LGBTQ community, actively seeks the presence and participation of LGBTQ Jews, advocates for them, and speaks out against the hostility that often confronts them.

Ohr Kodesh has embraced LGBTQ inclusivity because LGBTQ inclusivity reflects the Jewish values and *mitzvot* we espouse and seek to observe. Keshet, an organization that works for LGBTQ equality in Jewish life, has identified seven of those values and *mitzvot*. They are:

- ***Kavod.*** *Respect.* Show respect for all, despite our differences.
- ***Shalom bayit.*** *Domestic harmony.* Establish peace in our homes, our synagogues, schools, youth groups, and camps.
- ***B'tzelem Elokim.*** *In G-d's Image.* Recognize the humanity and dignity in all people.
- ***Kol Yisrael arevim zeh bazez.*** *Communal Responsibility.* Share the responsibility to build the kind of community in which we want to live.
- ***Sh'mirat halashon.*** *Guarding one's speech.* Refrain from using hurtful language.
- ***V'ahavta l'reiacha kamocha.*** *Love your neighbor as yourself.* Become accepting of others.
- ***Al tifrosh min hatsibur.*** *Do not separate yourself from the community.* Show solidarity with the entire community, including others who are different from you.

Rabbi Ephraim Mirvis, the chief rabbi of the United Kingdom, has identified two additional *mitzvot*:

- ***Lo ta'amod al dam reiecha.*** *Do not stand idly by your neighbor's blood.* Stand up to bullying.
- ***Vlo tonu ish et amito.*** *Do not wrong your fellow.* Do not intentionally hurt people's feelings.

Ohr Kodesh recognizes that when we embrace the LGBTQ community with kindness and respect, we are not only fulfilling *mitzvot*, we are also practicing *Tikkun Middot*, the cultivation of our own character and virtues.

To foster an environment that is welcoming to the LGBTQ community, in early 2019 our synagogue formed the LGBTQ Inclusion Task Force. Since then, the Task Force, together with our staff, has been hard at work. We provided training to our lay leaders, educational leaders, teachers, and youth leaders on LGBTQ inclusivity issues; updated the non-discrimination and harassment provisions of our personnel policy; reviewed our administrative forms for gender identifiers and other non-

inclusive language; created an LGBTQ section for our eagerly anticipated new website; added resources to the ECC and Salzberg Family libraries; and more.

As you may know, every June the LGBTQ community around the world and their families, friends, and allies celebrate their pride in being able to freely demonstrate their sexual diversity. Consequently, June is widely known as Pride Month.

In recognition and celebration of Pride Month, Ohr Kodesh had planned several events and activities, including having Joy Ladin, Ph.D., a nationally known speaker on transgender issues and on gender and Jewish identity, deliver a *Shabbat* morning *Dvar Torah*; staffing a booth in a tent at the DC Pride Festival; and having an LGBTQ-themed Learners' Lunch.

Sadly, due to the pernicious pandemic, our Pride Month programming and activities have been postponed or cancelled. But you can still celebrate Pride Month in the safety and comfort of your own home. How? Here are a few ideas:

- Borrow, buy, or download one or both of Joy Ladin's two works on LGBTQ issues, *The Soul of the Stranger: Reading God and Torah from a Transgender Perspective* and *Through the Door of Life: A Jewish Journey between Genders*.
- Listen to Krista Tippett interview Dr. Ladin on the program *On Being with Krista Tippett* (<https://onbeing.org/programs/joy-ladin-finding-a-home-in-yourself/>).
- Watch one or more YouTube videos featuring Dr. Ladin, including one in which she delivers a TEDx talk entitled *Ain't I A Woman?* (<https://youtu.be/g0K2YvvQyEw>).
- Participate in the evening book group on June 4 via Zoom (find the link to the June eOk calendar at [ohrkodesh.org](http://ohrkodesh.org); the link to the book group is listed in the calendar) when the novel *On Division*, by Goldie Goldbloom, a mother of eight children who is a Hassidic and LGBTQ activist, will be discussed.
- Borrow, buy, rent, or stream Jewish and LGBTQ-themed movies such as *Trembling Before God*, *Eyes Wide Open*, *Out in the Dark*, *Yossi & Jagger*, *Who's Gonna Love Me Now*, *Paragraph 175*, *Aimee & Jaguar*, and *Disobedience*.




