# 62<sup>nd</sup> Meeting of the *Commission on the Status of Women* (CSW62) at the United Nations in New York March 12-23, 2018

The Commission on the Status of Women (CSW) is the principle global intergovernmental body exclusively devoted to promoting women's rights, documenting the reality of women's lives throughout the world, and shaping global standards on gender equality and the empowerment of women.

During the Commission's annual two-week session at UN headquarters in New York, representatives of UN Member States, civil society organizations and UN entities gather to discuss progress and gaps in the implementation of the 1995 <u>Beijing Declaration and Platform for Action</u>, the key global policy document on gender equality, as well as contributing to the follow up to the <u>2030 agenda for Sustainable Development</u> so as to accelerate the realization of gender equality and the empowerment of women.

The CSW arranges the work of the sessions around priority and review themes. The themes for CSW62 are:

#### • Priority theme:

Challenges and opportunities in achieving gender equality and the empowerment of rural women and girls;

### • Review theme:

Participation in and access of women to the media, and information and communications technologies and their impact on and use as an instrument for the advancement and empowerment of women (<u>agreed conclusions</u> of the forty-seventh session).

The League of Women Voters of the United States has been an active participant in the Commission on the Status of Women meetings since its inception in 1946; presenting and commenting at Commission meetings, sponsoring panels and events, and having League members involved and in attendance.

NGO CSW, New York, sponsors the NGOCSW *Forum* of events and panels focused on the priority and review themes, advocacy trainings, briefings on CSW discussions and draft outcome documents and opportunities to attend regional caucuses.
