Dear Parents of Blue Door,

This week we learned about the weather. During our Circle Time the teacher talked about the different types of weather there are such as wind, rain, snow and sunlight. As usual, we reviewed the shapes and colors. Each day the children looked out the window to see how the weather was.

For Art, the children made a rainy day by gluing clouds, raindrops, and lightning to black construction paper. Rainy day rainbow art project was lots of fun. The children glued the colors of the rainbow strips and as they glued them onto the construction paper they were asked what color each strip was. Once finished they were asked to name the color on their paper once again. Gluing the raindrops on any color they chose of the rainbow was lots of fun. If your child chose to they were able to make a rainbow square collage. The paper plate umbrella was fun as well. They decorated it by coloring it and gluing on foam shapes. For the handle, they used a pipe cleaner. Mixing black and white paint to make gray was lots of fun. This was a great sensory activity that the children enjoyed very much. Making a snowflake was lots of fun. The children were given white paper in square shapes and then put on the glue dots on their paper. They decorated their snowflakes by using mosaic squares.

For story time they listened to the stories: Biscuits Snowy Day, Llama Llama Misses Mama, A Windy Day, Que Es El Sol? Cool Pinguin, Snoopy Flying to the Rescue, Hully Gully, How many? Vanessa and the Angel, and Hands Are Not For Hitting.

Playing in the centers is always a great time for the children. They have lots of fun pretending to cook, putting their baby to sleep, feeding their baby, and pretending to be doctors.
