Hello Rainbow Door Parents,

We had a great week! The children learned about Outer space this week. They learned that one of the easiest ways to teach your preschooler about outer space is to start with the sun and planets. Explain that the sun is a star and it is what gives light and life to our solar system. The planets orbit around the sun. Some planets are bigger than others and some are closer to the sun than others.

Art- The students made a solar system using paper plates, black paint, glue, and all planets previously cut .They painted the paper plate in black and glued the shapes on the paper plate ring. They made a rocketship using square pieces of construction paper; they wrote each letter of their name, then they glued the letters in order on a construction paper. They added stars shapes and fire at the bottom. The children made also a Star twirler using blue crayons and stars previously cut from a yellow construction paper. On Friday, they worked on their journals.

Circle Time- we are continuing to have one student per week come up to the board and go over the calendar, the days of the week, the months of the year, the sounds of the letters, and the numbers up to 30.

Music and movement- This week Mrs. Michelle, our music teacher, brought her small drum, and showed the students how she plays it using kitchen utensils such as a spoon and a fork. At soccer  the kids played Four Corners, and worked on controlling the ball with their feet.
