Next week we are going to finish our tour to the continents with Antarctica.

Antarctica has no countries and very few people go there. Only scientists go to Antarctica to learn more about the land, glaciers, ocean, weather, and animals that live there. Antarctica is the coldest place on earth and also is located in the southern hemisphere.
