In Language Arts and Reading, our essential question was, "How do animals help each other?" This week we talk about how the same animals form a group to help each other find food or look out for danger like a group of gorillas or wild dogs. We also discussed how unusual pairs of animals can help each other like a bird and rhino, an ant and caterpillar, a shrimp and a goby, and a zebra and a wildebeest. Our sound of the week was the long e. Even though we know that sound, we learned four other ways that make the long e sound such as: e, ee, ea, and ie. We also reviewed what prefixes are, which is a part of a word, put at the beginning of a word to change the meaning.

In math, we started Chapter 8. This week the students learned how to count forward and backward. They also learned to skip count. There are 5 different ways to skip count: by 2s, 3s, 4s, 5s, and 10s. We even listened to some songs to help us out. Next week, we will be continuing this chapter.

In Science, we started a new topic, Plant and Animal Life cycles. First, we did an experiment where the students had to wet a paper towel and put lima beans inside the paper towel and put it in a Ziploc bag to see what will happen in a few days. We predicted that it would become a plant. Then we discussed what is a life cycle and then talked about a plant life cycle and an animal life cycle. Next week, we will start a new topic.
