Hello Parents of Gold Door Students,

This week was a short week but we learned so much in our classrooms!

In language arts, we finished Unit 5. We had two letters this week, they were the consonants f and r. We also had two sight words, with and he. Our question of the week was about different foods that grow on farms. Our story was called "An Orange in January" and it was about how oranges grow on farms and eventually land in stores. We also read "Farms Around the World." This story taught us about potatoes, rice, and bananas. The children wrote about their favorite fruit and vegetable and how it is grown on a farm, picked by a farmer, and sent off to a store for them to buy. Next week we will begin Unit 6 and discuss seasons.

In math, we continued with Chapter 7. We continued with the teen numbers 14-19. The children learned how to show it on a ten frame and identify the number words. They also practiced the math strategy of drawing pictures to help solve math problems.

This week in social studies we learned all about Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. We learned what he believed and fought for. We did a great activity using two colored eggs. The children discussed that even though the eggs may look different on the outside, inside the eggs they are the same. This was a great lesson to show children that no matter what we look like, we should all be treated fairly.
