Dear Parents,

We are excited with the month of November and what brings! The students are talking about the project they want to do and they are sharing their thoughts and input about it.

I would like to remind you that next week is a regular and academic week. I will try to make it as fun as possible to get into the holidays; yet, testing and learning will continue to happen!

This week we covered skills such as rereading, looking for root words and inflectional endings (ing, ed), identifying the plot of the story and details to support it. We also worked with present-tense verbs, open syllables, the long sound of letter i (i, y, igh, ie, i\_e) and compound words among other skills.

Some stories read this week: "The Hidden Sun," "Starry Night," and "Mr. Putter & Tabby See the Stars."

During math we worked with adding 2-Digit numbers by breaking numbers into tens and ones to then add faster. Some children still need more practice, you may look into lesson 4.3 to give your child extra practice.

We concluded our lesson about Native Americans with a diorama project and presentation. The students reviewed one of the regions covered and they made a diorama representing that region; then they presented the facts in class. This project was graded. I was simply delighted to see the excitement while working on this project and the conversations among the team members.

We will probably finish our Science studies next week, make sure your child is reading the small book sent home to help them support our learning. If everything goes as planned, they will have a chapter test next Friday.

We were happy to see Ms. Michelle back with her amazing instruments and teaching.
