What an exciting week we had! We talked and learned about Halloween and the children could not wait for it to be Thursday, ready in their costume for the Parade and all the activities planned for them.

During Circle Time, we talked about the symbol of Halloween such as the Jack O Lantern (a carved pumpkin), the witch and her black cat, the ghosts, and the Goblins. The children took turns talking about what costume they will be wearing for Halloween. We did not forget to learn the alphabet and we focused this week on the Letter H and learned words starting with H.

For art, the children traced the letter H using a stencil and retraced it with a marker and colored inside. They also traced a triangle and colored it to make candy corn. Another art project was making a ghost. For this, they used a paper plate, traced their hands, and glued them on the paper plate to make a ghost. On Wednesday, the children decorated their Halloween bags which they used for their parade.

For storytime, we read Halloween Mice, Scary, Scary Halloween, Alpha Oops, H is for Halloween, a Woogie of Witches, and A Dark, Dark Tale.
