Hello Orange Door Parents!

We had a wonderful week! We finished our Winter theme last week. This week the students learned all about the weather. They learned that weather systems consist of the movement of cold and warm air. They learned about rain, clouds, lightning, and thunderstorms. We had the students tell us on the playground each day what the weather was and we recorded the information for them. On Friday we discussed how the weather was for this week.

Art- The students created all sorts of weather crafts this week. They made rain windsocks using paper towel rolls, paint, cotton, glue, construction paper, and scissors. They made rainbows using paper plates, markers, glue, and tissue paper. They learned that a rainbow has six colors which are: red, orange, yellow, green, blue, and purple. They also made umbrellas using crayons, markers, paper plates, popsicle sticks, and glue. They traced the letter Y and glued mosaic squares on it, and on Friday they worked in their journals.

Circle time- In circle time this week, we went over our letters and numbers. We had the students take turns coming up to the board, and pointing to the letters in their names. The letter of the week was y. Parents, if you have a chance, ask your child if they can tell you three things that begin with the letter y.

Music and movement- We went to the garden this week, where the students had a chance to water the tomato plants that the Kindergarten students planted. They also had a chance to see the turtles. We have two turtles next to the garden named "Peaches and Cream". They love to eat vegetables and the students had a lot of fun watching them eat. For soccer this week, Ms. Jackie set up an obstacle course for the students. She had them practicing jumping with both feet together.

The students really enjoyed learning about the weather, and having lots of discussions in class about their favorite types of weather. Next week we are learning about Farm animals.
