Reminder that next week is Dr.Seuss Spirit Week. Below is the schedule for what to wear.

In Language Arts and Reading, we worked on base words and the ending -s, -ed, and -ing. Some words were fills, played, and yelling. Our class story this week was "The Forest" This story is about a class who went on a field trip to a forest. They learned all about trees, animals, and how to take care of our forests. In the end, the class planted a tree. The children loved the story because it was a non-fiction story about a real class trip. We also went over vocabulary words from the story like types, different, interesting, changing, and poisonous. Children wrote a sentence with the words and illustrated it. Since we are doing base words with different ending, we went back to identifying verbs in a sentence. The children practiced using the correct past or present tense in verbs. Please be on the look out for bonus spelling words. Parents, I will continue sending a book report home on Fridays to be done at home over the weekend. This will help students with practicing reading and reading comprehension. As mentioned before this will be a grade and your child will be marked down if they did not complete it on time.

In Math, we began Chapter 9. In this chapter the students will learn how to use tens and ones to add and subtract. This week the students learned how to model two digit numbers by drawing lines for the tens and circles for the ones. They also learned how to add tens and how to add tens and ones. For our activity, we played "Speed Math", where the students had to solve two digit addition problems on their dry erase boards. Next week we will continue with this chapter.

In Science we continued with our topic "Matter". The students learned that there are three states of matter which are a solid, liquid, and gas. They learned what those three words mean and we made a list of what is considered a solid a liquid or a gas. Next week we will finish our lesson on this topic.
