Dear Parents,

Our topic for this week was "Clothes". During Circle Time, we talked about the different clothes that we wear depending on the weather and where we live. Why are we wearing clothes? The children told us because we don't want to be naked and because clothes protect us from the cold or the sun. The children told us also what was their favorite clothes and how much they love to choose the clothes they are going to wear. We also looked at pictures of some traditional clothes in other countries: they were surprised to learn that in Scotland, men are wearing skirts called Kilts for special occasions.

The letter of the week was the letter Y and the children guessed words starting with this letter: yo-yo, yogurt, yesterday, yawn, yak, yolk, yellow.

The favorite story of this week was: "Mrs. Mac Nosh Hangs Up Her Wash": Each Monday Mrs. Nelly Mc Nosh brings out a barrel and does a big wash. Mrs. Mc Nosh's wash is certainly big and definitely wacky. She hangs clothes and also a lot of things: you will be surprised to see what is hanging on her clothesline by the end of the day! We also read "Kiss Me, I'm Perfect", "A Color of His Own", and "Dressed Up Around The World".

During small group/Art, the children traced the letter Y and colored it with a yellow crayon and they glued a yellow material. Like Mrs. Mc Nosh, they made a "hanging laundry scenery" gluing two popsicles stick and yarn to make the clothesline and clothes shapes. They worked in their journal, traced a pajama using a stencil, and decorated it. They rolled the Play- Doh to make the letter Y and also practiced writing it.
