Dear Parents,

The topic this week was Life Cycle and the letter was Kk. This week's discussion about the life cycle has allowed our students to better understand the world around them and connect with nature. We have explained the life cycle of plants, frogs, butterflies, chicks, and humans. This week our students traced and colored the letter Kk. To practice their fine motor skills, they wrote the following words: kite, kiwi, kangaroo, kitten, and kiss. They drew the life cycle on a flower: seed, roots, stem, leaves and finally the flower. They made a frog life cycle headband that included the four stages of the frog: egg, tadpole, froglet, and adult frog. They traced and colored a butterfly and in each wing, they drew the stages of a butterfly: egg, caterpillar, chrysalis, and butterfly. Our students drew the life cycle of a chick on the belly of a baby chick they've made. They worked on the Scholastic magazines: A Frog Grows Up, I Spy a Butterfly. A Caterpillar Grows Up, and Go, Seeds, Go. After reading the story: The Tiny Seed, they traced, colored, and used glue to make a Giant Sunflower. The children went to the garden and worked on their own Garden Journals. They counted and measured the tomatoes, green peppers, broccoli, and flower plants writing the answers on the spaces provided.
