HO HO HO! It is that special time of year again! This week, the topic was Christmas. The children first learned the history of Christmas. What does Christmas Day celebrate? Christmas celebrates the birth of Jesus Christ. When is Christmas Day celebrated? December 25th. Who celebrates this day? This day is a Christian holiday celebrated by Christians around the world. Many non-Christians also celebrate this day as a time of peace, joy, family, and giving of presents. What do people do to celebrate? There are lots of ways that people can celebrate Christmas. Most people get together with family and exchange gifts on Christmas morning. Many people attend church services either on Christmas Day or Christmas Eve. Christmas decorations are a big part of the holiday. People decorate their homes with festive lights and winter decorations. People also put up Christmas trees and decorate them with ornaments and lights. The tradition of the Christmas tree comes from the country of Germany. The earliest known decorations for the tree were apples. Academic enrichment and small group:

We also had a visit from Santa this week and the children got to take pictures with him and got books on Thursday.
