Hello Orange Door Parents!

This week Orange Door traveled back to the Cretaceous period to visit the dinosaurs. Dinosaur fossils have been found on all seven continents. All non-avian dinosaurs went extinct about 66 million years ago. There are roughly 700 known species of extinct dinosaurs. Modern birds are a kind of dinosaur because they share a common ancestor with non-avian dinosaurs (American Museum of Modern History).

Art- the students had a lot of fun making all things dinosaurs this week. They made dinosaur footprints using Do-A-Dot markers, construction paper, markers, glue, and pencils to trace. They made their own invented dinosaurs using paper, markers, and crayons. The students are getting really good at signing their names on all of their artwork. Parents, when you have a chance, check their bags for any artwork they might have put inside, with their names on it.

Circle Time- The letter of the week was Q. The students all had a chance to think of words that begin with the letter q, and we would write it on the board for them. We also gave them all new dinosaur names, and they loved it! For example, Sofia turned into Sofiasaures. We read dinosaur books and watched a couple of educational videos about dinosaurs.

Music and Movement- Music class was fun as always, and the students love to hear the teacher's musical stories. We had soccer with Ms. Jackie, and the kids loved running afterward!
