Dear Parents,

We had a great week celebrating St. Patrick's Day our own way reviewing the colors and focusing on the color GREEN.

We had different games with the discovery boxes showing and naming the objects inside: the green turtle, a red crayon, a green pear and a blue ball. We also made a matching game sorting green, red, blue, and yellow objects to drop in the respective green, red, blue, and yellow boxes.

Throughout the week, we took every opportunity to point at the colors of the toys or objects around us.

For art, the children decorated a pre-cut shamrock using Do a Dot markers and glued green tissue papers. They colored construction paper with dark and light green crayons and chalk. They made handprints to make a rainbow. Finally, we did one "mess free" painting activity: we put paper in a plastic bag with blue and yellow paint and the children patted the bag to mix the color and discovered the color Green.

Music time with Mrs. Michele was great. She brought a steel drum and the children could play with it using a spoon to make music.

As the children grow, they interact and play more together. It is always very cute to see them talking to each other (in a difficult to understand language) using intonation and body language (facial expression, hands). They love dancing together and holding hands and they are also willing to share a little more!
