Hello! This week we spoke about the Classroom Rules. During Circle Time the teacher went over the classroom rules with the children. In putting puzzles together your child is concentrating and this helps improve short-term memory and problem-solving. Using the puzzle as an exercise of the mind can spark imagination and increase creativity. Drawing a picture of themselves in the center they like the most was lots of fun for them and using different colored crayons too. As your child was coloring the teachers went around and asked the colors of the crayons they were using. Using Do-A-Dot markers was a blast as they love to fill their construction paper with the Do-A-Dot colors of their choice. The children were given tissue paper of all different colors and they ripped it and glued it onto construction paper. Ripping tissue paper is an amazing fine motor activity for kids. Tearing paper actually helps children develop so many essential skills such as hand strength, hand-eye coordination, precision, refined movements, and bilateral coordination.

Please do not forget to wash your child's blanket to be brought back to school on Tuesday. Make sure your child's nails are cut short so that way they do not scratch themselves or their friends.
