Dear Gold Door Parents,

This week we discussed the essential question: How can things in nature be used to make new things?. To further explore this topic the students read the following stories: When Bread Comes To Life-giving the students a look into how bread is made. We also read Look! A Home! which describes different ways to use our natural resources. As well as reading Spider-Woman Teaches the Navajo, a tale about a woman learning to weave rugs and blankets from a spider-woman using natural resources. And finally, we read Nature Artist about how different countries use their natural resources to create art. While reading these stories the students were introduced to new vocabulary words such as create, natural resources, design, weave, and knowledge. For writing the students wrote their own recipes making a list of things need to create their favorite foods.

For math, the students were introduced to Chapter 11 which discussed shorter, longer, taller different objects around the classroom. They also learned about weight, length, and height and how to measure them correctly, as well as using the length to measure how tall it is.

For science, the students learned how to help the earth using recycling, reduce, and reuse. We discussed compost and pollution and how they can be harmful to the earth.

Earth Day was this week and the students learned to sort their trash from plastic, cardboard, paper, and aluminum and created a picture using the art to display in our classroom.
