Dear Parents of Blue Door:

Hello! This week we learned about Farm Animals and the things that they eat. During Circle Time the teacher spoke about the different animals that live on a farm such as the horse, pig, hen, chick, and rabbit.

We also sang Old Macdonald Had a Farm and each child named an animal that lives on the farm. Each child was also asked to make the sound that animal that they named made.

For Art, they made a hen by gluing the beak, eye and the comb which is the red part at the top of it's face to the hens body. To represent the hay, they glued strips of yellow construction paper and glued eggs that were cut out white construction paper. On Tuesday, a baby paper plate was made. They colored a paper plate yellow and then glued the beak, legs and feathers to it. They had a great time using farm animals, they play with here at school, to make farm animal foot prints.

They took the farm animal of their choice and dipped it into paint and then onto construction paper. They had a blast making a cow by dipping their hand into paint and then onto construction paper. Using a small paper plate, they made their rabbits by adding the eyes, nose and ears to it.

While on the playground we practiced our gross motor skills by throwing the ball to one another, they ran two laps around the playground, they kicked the ball, and threw the ball to one another.

Parents, please don't forget to wash your children's blanket and return to school on Monday nice and clean. Please make sure their nails are cut short so that way they don't scratch themselves or their friends.
