Dear Parents,

This week was all about Reptiles; the children learned facts about Reptiles: they are cold blooded, they lay shelled eggs, they live on land or in the water. Most reptiles are snakes or lizards. During circle time, we looked at an educational video about reptiles. The children discovered that the most dangerous lizard is called the Komodo dragon: it looks like an alligator with a snake tongue. The children also learned the difference between a turtle and a tortoise: turtles live in the water, tortoises live on the land.

For small group/Art, the children used a stencil to trace a lizard and colored it with crayons or markers. They traced a turtle with a marker, used the scissor to cut in little pieces brown, yellow and green construction and glued the pieces to make a turtle mosaic. They practiced to write the word SNAKE on a white board and finally, they made an alligator paper puppet.

For story time, we read the following books: a color of his own, Snap!, There is an alligator under my bed, Bill and Pete and Rockabye Crocodile.

Their favorite story was about a mother duck who found an egg and brought it home. When the egg cracked, the duckling was different; green with a long tail and a snippy snap mouth but to Mother duck he was just adorable just like the other duckling!. The other animals were making fun of him until one day, he saved the ducks from the terrifying tiger by snapping at him.
