Dear Parents of Red Door,

This week the children learned about the traditional tales of The Three Little Pigs.

During Circle Time, we started the day by greeting the children by their names, and sang songs such as "Good Morning" song, ABC, What's the weather? , etc. We heard the read-aloud of the Three Little Pigs as we learned about pigs and did all kinds of fun " piggy" activities.

Throughout the day, the children had the chance to visit developmental play areas such as art, discovery, the library, blocks, housekeeping, and science except during lunch and nap time.

While practicing our language development, we read " The Three Little Pigs and "This and That Pig ".

For art, the children painted pictures on the easel using colorful paint and paintbrushes. They also built houses out of shreds of paper, blocks, and popsicle sticks, and they were challenged to blow their houses down. They played a sensory game of finding the toy under the "straw" and practiced rolling Play-Doh. Finally, the children wore pig snouts and pretended to be pigs while the teachers taught them the ASL sign for pigs.

For gross motor skills, the children played "here comes the wolf." The teacher pretended to be a wolf while the children were pigs. Huffed and puffed bubbles, kicking and throwing the balls, road tricycles, and music and movement.
