The children are participating more and more, clapping their hands or trying to use the puppets.

This week, our Music teacher, Mrs. Clarice, brought a tambourine and she read "Pete the Cat: Little Pumpkin".

Outdoor time was a blast as we could enjoy great weather: we played with bubbles, practiced going down the stairs, and to kick a ball.
