This week the children learned of all the different types of transportation. What type of transportation we can use for water, land, and air. We spoke about traffic signs and what kind of transportation uses rail.

The letter of the week was the letter K as in Kite! The children took turns practicing their writing skills by writing the letter K on the board. They also shared different words beginning with the letter K with their friends.

For art the children traced and decorated their own letter K. They also colored the shapes of three forms of transportation a boat, car, and plane then cut them out. Using paper and crayons they divided the paper into sky, land, and water, then used the shapes they cut out to glue them where they belong. The children also took time to share what their favorite form of transportation is in their journal and last but not least we used a container filled with water so the children could observe which one floats and what happens to each object.
