Dear Parents,

We started the week learning about Kwanzaa, one of the holidays celebrated during the month of December. We talked and learned about the seven days of Kwanzaa, we introduced the sights, sounds, and traditions of this community holiday. Kwanzaa is an African-American holiday that celebrates history, culture, and customs, and it has its roots in an African harvest festival. Music and drums are part of the celebration, which includes dancing, feasting, and praying. Red, green, and black are the three colors associated with Kwanzaa. Red represents the struggles people have endured. Green stands for fairness and justice. Black represents the people themselves. They also celebrate with a "bendera", or a flag that is used during Kwanzaa that has three horizontal stripes of red, black, and green. The Kinara, or candle holder holds three red candles, three green candles and one black. For each of the seven days, one principle is celebrated-Unity, Control, Cooperation, Sharing, Purpose, Creativity, and Faith.

For small group/art we made a kinara with a brown triangle for the base of the candleholder and three green, one black, and three red stripes for the seven candles. They also used Kwanzaa colors to work in their journals. We also made a holiday card. We reviewed the letters and numbers and did free Art.

This week we also had spirit week and the students participated with so much enthusiasm. They took pictures with Santa on Wednesday and sang holiday songs on Thursday.
