Hello Parents,

We had a great week preparing for our egg hunt! We made our own headbands and decorated our bags for the event. Please check out the pictures on Brightwheel or Facebook.

We also had a great field trip on the Fun Bus! It is our favorite! Remember, you can book the fun bus for your child's birthday.

In music class we played the egg shaker, it was a lot of fun!

Next week we will learn all about our Earth and recycling, please bring in one bag of recycling items. Be sure to rinse out anything that has liquid in it.

This week we discussed the essential question: What do good citizens do?. To further explore this topic the students read the story Hen Hears Gossip which is a story about a hen gossiping to different farm animals. We also read the story "We Can Play!" about a family playing at the park and riding their bikes sharing with other children. We enjoyed the story "The Little Red Hen" which told the students about a group of farm animals who weren't being good citizens to each other. While reading this story the students were introduced to new vocabulary such as citizen, respect, tidy, hauled, and necessary. The students learned the long vowel (i) this week practiced writing and making the sound of long vowel (I). For writing, the students wrote a sentence using first, next, and last using their favorite topic.

In math, we began our final chapter in our math book. Chapter 12 is all about sorting and classifying. We learned that we can sort and classify shapes by their size, color, and shape. Each day we reviewed a new way to classify. Next week we will learn to graph our responses and we will practice sorting using buttons and cereal.

In science, we discussed Springtime. We read a magazine that discussed our five senses and how we use them in spring. For example, touching the rain, smelling a flower, and seeing a bird. Then we read a magazine about rabbits. We learned that rabbits eat lettuce, dandelions, and carrots. They also communicate using different gestures. We made a bunny face. Finally, we learned about the life cycle of a butterfly. a butterfly has four stages, each with a specific name. On Thursday, we made a craft showing the four stages.
