Dear Parents,

During this week the children got to do something different to honor Dr. Seuss. Not only did they have fun dressing up, but, they also had the option to make a replica of one of their favorite characters using recycling items, other crafts and their creativity!

The Essential Question for Language Arts this week was "How can we classify and categorize things?" We discussed this topic and read stories and articles related to sorting or categorizing. Some of the stories read this week are "A Barn Full of Hats", "A Lost Button", and "Reduce, Reuse, Recycle."

We focused on the point of view of a character and looking for details to support our thoughts. We also covered irregular plurals and capitalization.

We started a new Math Chapter (Chapter 10) about shapes, we discussed: a cube, a rectangular prism, a square pyramid, a cylinder and a cone. The children are learning about some characteristics of these shapes, such as how many vertices, edges and faces they have; which shapes slide, roll or do both?

The children learned a few new games during P.E. class, "The River" and "Chase" The River seems to be the favorite among most children. The objective is to jump as far as they can while Ms. Jacquie moves the rope.

As usual, we enjoy the presence and enthusiasm of Ms. Clarice during music time. The students seemed to enjoy doing the jungle animals' sounds and movements!
