Hi! This week the children learned about Owls. During Circle Time they learned some fun facts about Owls. Owls can turn their heads almost all the way around and pictures of owls were shown as well. The smallest owl is called the Elf Owl. Another fun fact is that they come in many shades of colors which are the colors tan, gray, and brown. During our Circle Time, we go over the colors and shapes.

For Art, the children enjoyed making Owl thumb prints. They dipped their thumbs in paint and then onto construction paper. The flying paper plate Owl was lots of fun. They were given a small paper plate which they painted brown and glued brown construction paper that was the owl's wings and glued them to the plate. The children also glued the eyes and nose to their owl and I must say they did a great Job. The teacher traced each child's hand and cut it out and then had the children glue the eyes and nose to their handprint to make their owl. They had free art which is where the child uses markers or crayons and draws whatever it is they make like to.

For storytime they listened to these stories: The Very Hungry Caterpillar, Brown Bear, Brown Bear What Do You See?, Hands Are Not For Hitting, No More Diapers For Ducky, Eight Silly Monkeys Jumping On the Bed, Little Owl, and Pete the Cat and His Four Groovy Buttons.

Parents, please do not forget to send in clean clothing for your child as well as pull-ups if they are potty training. Please remember to potty train at home as well. Make sure your child's nails are cut short so that way they do not scratch themselves or their friends. Please go over the colors and shapes with your child at home and also how to hold a crayon correctly. We work very hard here at school. Reinforcement is very important.
