Dear Parents,

This week our topic was Halloween and the letter L. We started the week learning that Halloween is a holiday celebrated on October 31st. It is a holiday with a long history and can have different meanings for different people. People all around the world celebrate this day. The main tradition is to dress up in a costume. Some people like scary costumes such as ghosts, witches, or skeletons, but a lot of people dress up in fun costumes like superheroes, movie stars, or cartoon characters. We also did a ghost craft with shaving cream.

Journals: In their journals, they did a drawing of Halloween.

Books: Some of the books we read this week: Five Spooky Ghosts, Playing Tricks At School, Sixteen Runaway Pumpkins, Spooky Hour, Clifford's Halloween, Trick or Treat, Night Before Halloween, Halloween Mice, Best Halloween Ever, Halloween Howl, My Little "L" Book, and The Lamb Who Loved to Laugh.

The children got lots of treats and goodies. Thank you to all the families who donated treats and goodies for the school and candies for the homeless children, and to the ones who volunteered to help that day with various activities. We started the day by taking beautiful pictures of our kids dressed in great costumes and listening to them tell stories about who they were. They were so happy and proud! We had a wonderful fun-filled day with a fun storytime, art activity, and filled bags with candies for the less fortunate kids.
