Dear Parents of Blue Door,

This week the children learned about the Ocean and the different animals that live in it. During circle time the teacher talked about the different animals that live in the ocean such as sharks, dolphins, swordfish, manatee, blue whales, octopus, and jellyfish.

The children love to sing our circle time songs such as Good Morning, Number Rock, A, B, C Song, The Wheels on the Bus, Sticky Bubble Gum, and Blow the Balloon.

For art, the children made an Octopus by coloring half of a paper plate using crayons, then added the eyes, and then glued the appendages which are the arms. Once again practicing their fine motor skills by coloring, they colored a small paper plate blue to represent a fish. They had a blast making a turtle by coloring a small paper plate green and then added the head and legs to it. Using different Play-Doh tools, they squeezed and flattened Play-Doh. As always, they worked in their journals by coloring a fish blue and using mosaic squares to decorate it. Using blue crayons, they colored a whale and rolled up into little balls of blue tissue paper and glued it onto the whale.

Their favorite time of the day is when they get to go to the housekeeping library, science, block area, and discovery.

On the playground they also practiced their gross motor skills by jumping in place, rode tricycles, the teacher put out the Hula Hoops on the ground and had each child jump in and jump out, they ran 2 laps around the playground and enjoyed having a basketball game.

This week the children had lots of fun going into the garden and planting flowers, Mrs. Davis took pictures, be sure to check those out. They did a great job.
