Cornerstone Corner

February's Character Trait: Determination

In February, Project Cornerstone ABC readers in grades 1-5 read *Long Shot*, by NBA player Chris Paul. In the book, readers visit Chris Paul's childhood and experience how his dream to play basketball required hard work and dedication. Initially teased because he was small, Chris Paul shows readers that you are *never too small to dream big*.

ABC readers are facilitating discussions and activities to help kids identify their sparks, passions, and their goal champions who support them. Kids are learning how to create a goal-setting plan or use a GPS to reach a goal. Sometimes there are unexpected or challenging roadblocks in a planned route, so students are practicing shifting gears and navigating an alternate route to reach the destination. ABC readers are also discussing the growth mindset by sharing inspirational stories of people who failed or were rejected many times before finding success, such as Thomas Edison and J.K Rowling. We encourage our Cool Cats to dream big, make a plan, and persevere!
