Principal's Message

As Halloween is around the corner and students might be on the lookout for that perfect costume for the school parade and other celebrations, here are a few friendly tips and reminders:

1. Please remember that costumes should be age appropriate and culturally sensitive. This will help to avoid inadvertently mimicking any individual or group of people.
2. Avoid scary costumes that could frighten young children. No weapons, blood, or masks. If a costume is found to be inappropriate, your child will be asked to change out of their costume.
3. Hair Dye and/or spray should be administered at home and not brought to school.

4. Unattached parts of costumes can get lost easily at school, so you may want to leave them at home.
5. Our goal is to promote Halloween in a fun, safe, and respectful manner. Your support is appreciated!

If your child decides to dress up (it's optional), please have them come to school in costume. Children must bring a change of clothes as they will take off their costumes at recess. Kindergarteners will remain in their costumes. The annual parade will begin at approximately 8:30A.M. and will take place on the blacktop. All grade levels will be assigned space on the perimeter of the blacktop and will be provided an opportunity to show-off their Halloween spirit! We invite families to enjoy this event as there will be designated space to watch from the outer perimeter of the parade circle. Additional details will be provided in The Avenue next week.
