# DIY Paper Fidget Spinner

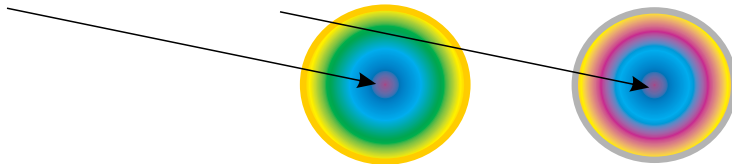
Step 1: Print on cardstock paper.

Step 2: Cut out all the fidget spinner parts on the first page of this activity.

Step 3: Using a large sewing needle make a small hole in the middle of the fidget spinner (adult help is required).



Step 4: Do the same small hole for 2 fidget spinner centers.

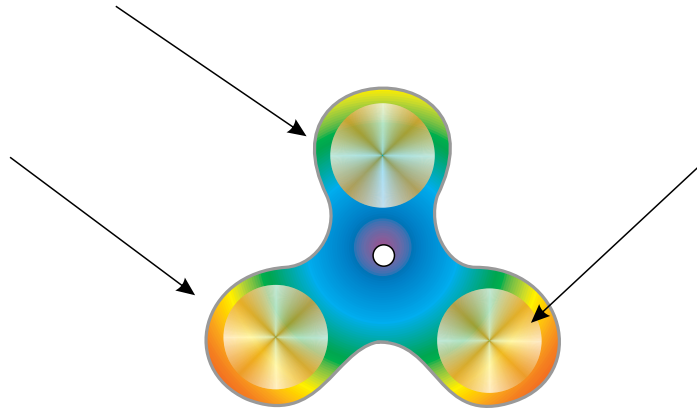


Step 5: Using a round pointed-edge toothpick, poke the toothpick through the holes you created with the sewing needle (both fidget spinners and centers).

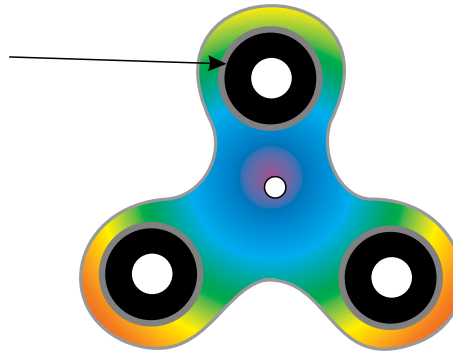
Step 6: Glue both sides of the Fidget Spinner together matching up the center holes.

# DIY Paper Fidget Spinner

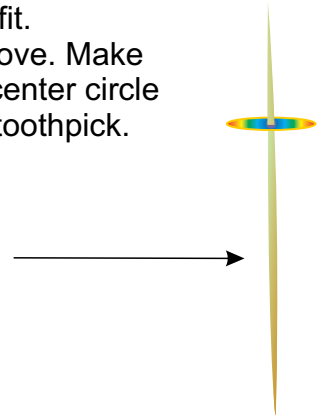
Step 7: Glue coins (pennies works best) or buttons to each end of the Fidget Spinner. Do this for one side only.



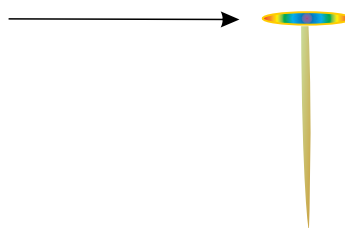
Step 8: Glue the circles on top of the coins.



Step 9: Poke a toothpick through the center circle part so that it is a tight fit. Afterwards glue around the toothpick so that the center circle does not move. Make sure that the center circle is straight and levelled. Glue the bottom of the center circle part where it meets the toothpick. This will prevent it from moving on the toothpick.



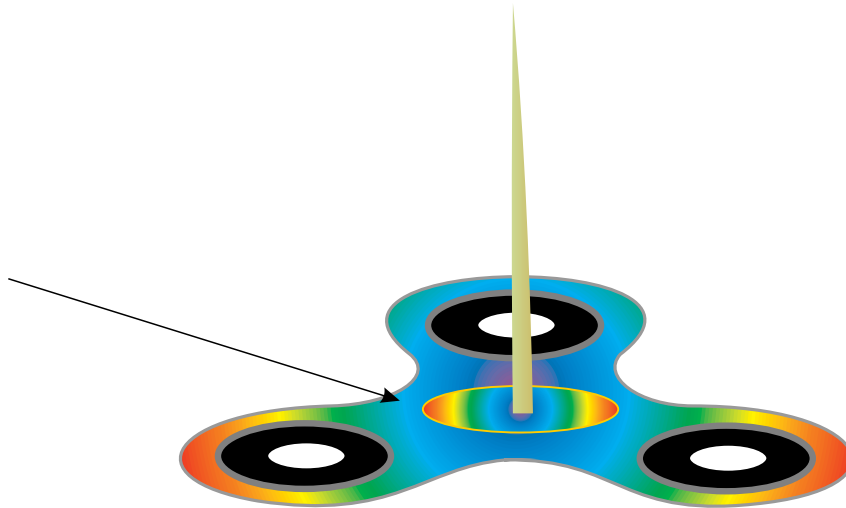
Step 10: Using a wire cutter or scissors cut off the top of the toothpick as close to the center circle part as possible.



# DIY Paper Fidget Spinner

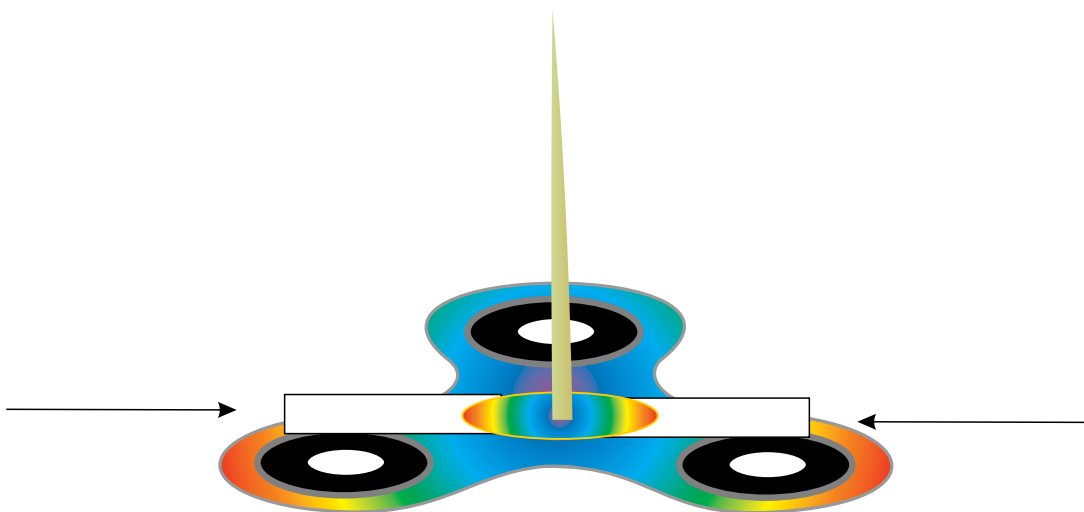
Step 11: Placing the toothpick face up with the toothpick pointing upwards, slide the fidget spinner body onto the toothpick.

Step 12: Place the other center circle through the toothpick until it reaches the fidget body.



Step 13: Slide a couple of pieces of scrap stock paper between each center circle and the fidget body to use as spacers. Do this on both sides.

Step 14: Glue the last center circle to the toothpick. When dry remove the paper spacers.



# DIY Paper Fidget Spinner

Step 15: Using a wire cutter or scissors cut off the top of the toothpick as close to the center circle as possible.

Step 16: Glue the matching center circles in the center of the fidget spinner on both sides. This will cover the toothpick ends. Glue circles on the other side of the fidget spinner.

You should now have a multi-colored fidget spinner on both sides. Your Fidget Spinner should spin freely.
