Project Objectives

Project Components

- Formation and training of youth entrepreneurs;
- 2. Funding for training and equipment;
- 3. Self-Help component for migrant youth.







Outcome

1. Establishment of a sustainable program of personal and professional development and technical training for youth in entrepreneurship and employment in accordance with their personal interests, conditions and resources available, in partnership with national and international stakeholders who work in the field of community economic development, migration, and youth.
