

Community baby shower to combat infant mortality scheduled for Sept. 9 in Mansfield

Richland Source is recruiting additional organizations who would like to tie their brand or cause to a big newsworthy event that will get them massive public exposure. This event will get you in front of hundreds of thousands of people in Richland, Ashland and Crawford County who are paying attention to it. The baby shower will take place at the [Idea Works](#), Richland Source's new location, at 40 W. Fourth St.

Richland Source received the grant in early 2017 to further the work started in the series [Healing Hope](#), discussing the issues of infant mortality and the services available to combat it. This series of stories delves deeper into the cause of that problem and offers potential solutions in dealing with it. It was determined that safe-sleep education was among the best tools to fight that statistic.

Ohio has one of the worst infant mortality rates in the nation and Richland County ranks among the bottom of the state's statistics in the same category.
