## JUNETEENTH

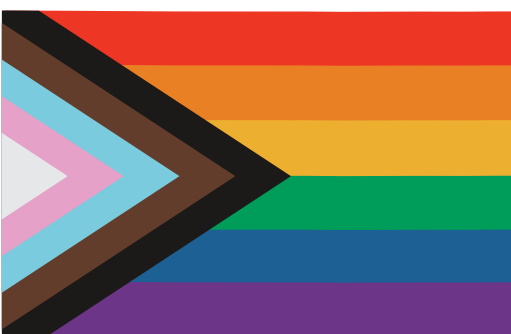
Juneteenth, celebrated on June 19th, marks the true end of slavery in the United States. It commemorates the day in 1865 when Union General Gordon Granger arrived in Galveston, Texas, and declared that all enslaved people were free, in line with President Abraham Lincoln's Emancipation Proclamation from 1863.

Juneteenth, now a federal holiday, is a time for celebration and reflection, featuring resilience, parades, cultural events, and educational activities. It honors African American history and culture, while acknowledging the ongoing struggle for equality and justice.

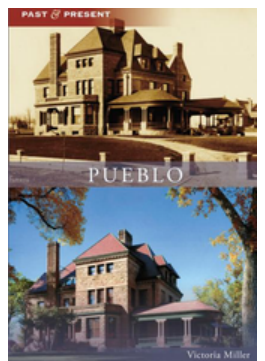
### PUEBLO: PAST & PRESENT - PRESENTATION AND BOOK SIGNING

Join historian, archivist, and curator Victoria Miller as she presents on her latest book, "Pueblo: Past & Present."

Located at the confluence of the Arkansas River and Fountain Creek, Pueblo, Colorado, began as a trading post but formally incorporated as a city in 1870. Early visionaries quickly developed business, heavy industry, and other enterprises that, in turn, attracted diverse communities making the city what it is today. The Past and Present series published by Arcadia Press compares historical images of architectural and natural elements of Pueblo with contemporary photographs.

Victoria Miller is a Pueblo native and selected images documenting Pueblo from local archival repositories. A resident for more than 35 years, she works as the curator and certified archivist of the Steelworks Center of the West. She earned a Bachelor of Arts degree in history from Colorado State University-Pueblo and a Master of Arts degree in museum science from Texas Tech University.

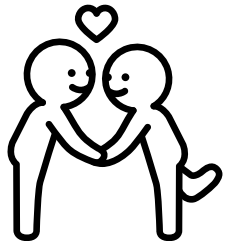

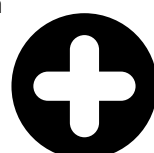
