GREETINGS FROM THE MAYOR'S OFFICE

As I put my thoughts down for the September newsletter, I cannot help but think about what the rest of us are all thinking: When will these road projects be done? The good news is the biggest one impacting us right now is Kinney, and it should be done and fully open for all traffic by the time this newsletter is shared with the public. While this was a challenging summer to navigate through that area, I cannot help but think of a few relevant thoughts. One, the smaller number of north/south roads in our city becomes more noticeable when we have construction on one of them, especially the roads with higher traffic. This is an area in which we have begun to take a firmer stance with development in the city as we have come to realize the importance of those north/south arteries keeping pace with the needs of our city.



Second, it is critical to coordinate with other municipalities or agencies regarding the projects they are working on in that area. That might not have gone as smoothly as we wanted to start the summer, but we did get through it and will do better in the future. Third, thank you for your support in doing these needed projects and for having patience and civility with one another (and the workers) while the work continues. And quite frankly, thank you for paying for them. We know that money to fund the projects comes from the taxes that we all pay. When we see we have a problem that needs a solution, the trust and support from this community are quite often without words. On behalf of our city staff, the construction workers, and elected officials, thank you for your continued backing of these projects.

The other update I am proud to share is that the library continues to move forward at a strong pace. All the community open houses we had to gather feedback have been critical in forming what we need in the new building, both in structure and services. The ongoing refinement of the outside and inside of the building continues to narrow down to what will be a finished product. Look for more specifics for that final set of plans to come later this fall, closer to the holiday season. Because we will close the current library building, the city and Kent District Library have agreed to open a temporary library in Standale. More details will be provided in an upcoming newsletter and on social media. What I can share is that the temporary library will open sometime after the first of the year. This will allow our construction crews to work on the new building and renovate the old one without delay or interruption. Additionally, knowing who and what our community is and maintaining that sense of place throughout construction guided us to the temporary storefront in Standale.

SAFER TRAIL CROSSINGS

This summer, the Grand Valley Metropolitan Council (GVMC) is piloting a new program by installing demonstration projects within local communities. Complete Streets enables safe access for all street users, including pedestrians, bicyclists, motorists, and transit riders. Demonstration projects allow trying out transportation network changes before making a permanent commitment. On August 20, a pedestrian island was placed at the Fredrick Meijer Standale Trail Crossing at Leonard Street. It will be in place through mid-October. Your feedback on this temporary project will help inform more long-term solutions.



MAILBOX SHAKE TEST

As you prep your yard and home for fall, make sure to check your mailbox.

Now is the perfect time to perform the shake test to ensure that your mailbox can withstand snow removal.

Grab your mailbox and shake it. If the post for the mailbox moves easily, it will not hold up for winter maintenance in your area.

INCOME TAX DEPARTMENT UPDATES

DUE DATES

Third quarter estimated payments for calendar year 2024 are due September 30, 2024. Forms are available on our [website](#).

WHERE'S MY REFUND?

Refunds for 2023 timely filed returns are still being processed and will be completed soon. We appreciate your patience. If you received a letter requesting more information, please respond as soon as possible. If we do not receive the required information, deductions and credits will be disallowed resulting in a lower refund or an assessment. You can provide missing information several ways:

FORGOTTEN RETURNS

If you have past years of Walker returns that you have forgotten to file, contact the tax department immediately at 616-791-6880. If you file prior year returns and pay the tax and interest due, you may request a waiver of penalty. If the tax department contacts you first regarding unfiled returns, you will not be eligible for a waiver of penalty. We are electronically matching State of Michigan returns filed from a Walker resident address with Walker returns filed. If you have forgotten to file Walker returns from prior years, now is the time to get that cleared up before the letters go out from this matching program.

MISSING INFORMATION

Did you receive a request for information related to your 2023 Walker income tax return? If we did not receive the information upon request from the taxpayer, deductions and credits will be disallowed resulting in a lower refund or assessment. If you were expecting a refund, but have received a proposed assessment or reduced refund, there is still time to provide the required information. You must send us proof of the credit/deduction within 30 days of the date you received the notice that we adjusted your return. CLERK'S DEPARTMENT UPDATES

State General Election

- Election Day: Tuesday, November 5, from 7:00 AM – 8:00 PM. More information to come.
- Early Voting: Available to Walker registered voters October 26th -November 3rd from 8:00 AM – 4:00 PM located at the Walker Commission Chambers.
- Register to Vote: The last day to register to vote by mail or in-person anywhere but the Walker City Clerk's Office for this election is October 21, 2024. Eligible Walker residents with proof of residency can register to vote in-person at the Clerk's office by 8:00 PM on Election Day.

DID YOU KNOW?

By going to [MI.gov/vote](#) you can:

- Request an absentee ballot and vote from home
- Update your address
- Register to vote
- Verify you are registered to vote
- Find your polling location
- Track the status of your ballot
- See what will be on your ballot

Those who wish to vote absentee can request an absentee ballot for the upcoming elections.


The Clerk's office anticipates mailing absentee ballots out the last week of September. Absentee ballots are always available **40 days before any election** in-person during regular business hours at the Clerk's Office or by filling out an application for an absentee ballot.

Apply for an Absentee Ballot Online – Your completed application will automatically be sent to the City Clerk's Office so we can mail out your absentee ballot.

Apply for an Absentee Ballot By Mail - You can download the application form and return it by mail or drop it in one of the City's designated elections drop boxes. You can also email the signed and completed application. Once your application is received, your absentee ballot will be mailed to you.

BACK TO SCHOOL SAFETY TIPS

- Arrive early and stand away from the curb when waiting for the school bus.
- Board the bus only when it has stopped completely.
- Stay visible to the bus driver and never walk behind the bus.
- Cross streets at corners, obey signals, and use crosswalks.
- Wear seat belts in cars and use car seats or booster seats as needed.
- Teen drivers should wear seat belts, avoid distractions, and not use cell phones.
- Cyclists should wear helmets and ride on the right side of the road.
- Walkers should cross streets at intersections with crossing guards.
- Parents should accompany young or new students to school initially and encourage walking in groups.

As we often do during summer months, we recently saw a spike in our Larceny from Vehicle calls. Nearly all the vehicles had been left unlocked. Leaving vehicles unlocked makes it all too easy for thieves to have a productive evening. When thieves find so many vehicles left unlocked, they will continue to come back, as they know an area is an easy and fruitful target. Please be diligent in removing firearms, keys, and valuables from your vehicle when they are left unattended. Once you do so, LOCK YOUR DOORS. Remind your friends and neighbors to do so as well.


