

NEIGHBORHOOD GREENWAYS

- Low-stress residential streets
 - Alternative to busier arterial streets
- Safe and comfortable connections for people biking and walking
- All ages and abilities (8 years old to 80 years old)
- Organization of the street so everyone has a place
- Traffic calming for safe and predictable speeds
- Connections to schools, parks, and other neighborhood destinations





















DICKENS GREENWAY

- Identified in the Streets for Cycling Plan
- Connecting people to Oz Park, Lincoln Park, Schools, Retail Corridors
- Providing a family-friendly alternative to bicycling on Armitage
- Transitions between one-way and two-way
- Wide one-way street
- Lower traffic volumes
